

LiveSimply

Criteria for live simply: To take action towards living a simpler lifestyle including slowing down and finding time to pray and reflect, refusing and reducing on what we consume, spending more time on the simpler things in life including reflective time with family and friends, time in nature.

Brief description of main action:

We will take part in World Food Day as a whole school. Each class will plant seeds to harvest in the Spring, for example onions, beans and peas to use in our school kitchen. They will sow the seeds in our raised beds and some will be kept in the poly tunnel.

How will you plan for a wider community engagement?

Alongside this, we will be collecting food for our local food bank. Our School Council will make contact with them to discuss what they need most.

Produce grown will also be avaiable for our school families to use at home.

Teachers and pupils are encouraged to be thoughtful about how our actions affect both the ecosystems in our backyard and the planet.

How will you plan for a wider community engagement? We will invite the refugees into our school and present them with the art work. Our choir will sing for them and their choir will also sing for us.

Live in Solidarity

Brief description of main action:

We will set up a Christmas jumper swap shop. Families will be contacted and asked to donate an old Christmas jumper. We will then hold an event in the school hall where families can bring a pound and swap their jumper. School council and CAFOD Club will drive the campaign and design posters to put around the school.

Money collected will be donated to CAFOD World gifts to support our global neighbours. As a whole school we will decide which gift/s we will choose.

How will you plan for a wider community engagement? Families will be invited to take part in the Christmas jumper swop. CAFOD Prayer cards will be sent home to all families.
